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

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## ABSTRAK

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Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk menjelaskan kategori-kategori hiponimi yang ditemukan dalam bahasa Lio. Teori semantic dengan pendekatan hiponimi digunakan untuk menjawab masalah penelitian. Metode yang digunakan dalam penelitian ini adalah metode kualitatif. Data diambil dalam bentuk percakapan dan ucapan sehari-hari yang digunakan masyarakat Lio.

Hasil dari penelitian ini menunjukkan bahwa terdapat tiga puluh delapan kategori hiponimi yang ditemukan dalam bahasa Lio. Kategori-kategori hiponimi tersebut adalah warna, keluarga, kegiatan sehari-hari, wanita, duduk, rasa, memasak, dapur, sayur-sayuran, tali, kaki, jumlah, kamar, pakaian, minum, bagian tubuh, tidur, membawah, berbicara, hewan berkaki empat, biji, pria, tangan, pekerjaan, tempat, sekolah, mulut, buah, unggas, bunga, makanan, rumah, serangga, reptile, perasaan, hewan pemakan segala, cuaca dan hewan.

## ABSTRACT

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This study aimed to explain the categories of hyponymy found in the Lio language. Semantic theory and hyponymy approach was used to answer the problem of study. This study used qualitative method. The data were taken in the form of daily conversations and utterances used by the Lio people.

The results of this study indicate that there are thirty eight categories of hyponymy found in the Lio language. The categories of hyponymy are color, family, daily activities, woman, sitting, tasting, cooking, kitchen, vegetables, rope, legs, number, room, clothing, drinking, body parts, sleeping, carrying, talking, quadruped, seed, man, hand, work, place, school, mouth, fruit, fowl, flowers, food, houses, insects, reptiles, food, all-eating animals, weather and animals.
