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ABSTRAK

Penelitian ini tentang adaptasi dari novel ke dalam film *The Giver*, yang mana bertujuan untuk mengetahui persamaan dan perbedaan dalam mengadaptasi novel ke dalam film *The Giver*, dan bentuk-bentuk perubahan yang terjadi dalam mengadaptasi novel ke dalam film. Penelitian ini berfokus pada Teori adaptasi dari Anushiravani dan Elinezhadi tentang persamaan dan perbedaan, dan juga menggunakan Teori dari Eneste tentang bentuk perubahan dalam proses adaptasi dari novel ke dalam film *The Giver*. Data dianalisis melalui metode kualitatif. Penelitian ini menggunakan catatan dijadikan instrumen untuk mendapatkan data yang valid. Dalam penelitian ini, data diambil dari kutipan berupa kata, frasa, kalimat, dialog, dan gambar.

Hasil penelitian ini menunjukan bahwa ada tiga jenis persamaan dan perbedaan yang dapat dilihat dari unsur intrinsik seperti tema, karakter, dan latar, serta bentuk perubahan dalam proses adaptasi, yaitu: pengurangan, penambahan, dan perubahan variasi/modifikasi. Persamaan dan perbedaan dalam penelitian ini mengungkapkan bahwa proses adaptasi hanya ditemukan tiga unsur intrinsic seperti tema, karakter dan latar. Sedangkan ketiga jenis perubahan dalam penelitian ini mengungkapkan bahwa proses adaptasi hanya ditemukan pada karakter dan elemen setting antara novel dan film sehingga membuat cerita menjadi menarik dan sempurna bagi penonton.

ABSTRACT

This research is about the adaptation of the novel into the movie The Giver, which aims to find out the similarities and differences in adapting the novel into the movie The Giver, and the forms of change that occur in adapting the novel into the movie. This research focuses on Anushiravani and Elinezhadi's adaptation theory about similarities and differences, and also uses Eneste's theory about the forms of change in the adaptation process from the novel to the movie The Giver. The data is analyzed through qualitative methods. This research uses notes as an instrument to obtain valid data. In this study, the data were taken from quotations in the form of words, phrases, sentences, dialog, and images.

The results of this study show that there are three types of similarities and differences that can be seen from intrinsic elements such as theme, character, and setting, as well as forms of change in the adaptation process, namely: subtraction, addition, and variation/modification. The similarities and differences in this study reveal that the adaptation process only found three intrinsic elements such as theme, character and setting. While the three types of changes in this study reveal that the adaptation process is only found in the character and setting elements between the novel and the movie so as to make the story interesting and perfect for the audience.
