ABSTRAK

Adapun tujuan penelitian ini adalah untuk mengidentifikasi jenis-jenis tindak ilokusi fungsi tindak ilokusi yang di gunakan dalam upacara tu ngawu. Desain penelitian pada analisis ini adalah metode penelitian deskriptif kualitatif. penelitian ini menggunakan teori Searle dan teori Leech untuk menganalisis jenis dan fungsi tindak ilokusi. Data tersebut berupa ujaran. Dalam penelitian ini, data diambil dari ujaran- ujara yang mengandung tindak ilokusi ketika para juru bicara dari masing masing pihak berbicara satu sama lain dan rekam wawancara. Hasil penelitian ini menunjukan bahwa terdapat 30 tindak ilokusi yang digunakan dalam upacara tu ngawu yang terdiri dari beberapa jenis yaitu jenis asertif, direktif,komisif, ekspresif dan deklaratif. Jenis ilokusi yang paling banyak ditemukan adalah jenis asertif dengan 12 data, direktif 10 data, ekspresif 5 data komisif 1 data dan jenis deklaratif tidak ditemukan dalam penelitian ini. terdapat tiga fungsi yang ditemukan oleh peneliti, yaitu fungsi kompetitif, fungsi kovivial dan fungsi kolaboratif.

ABSRACT

This study aims to determine the types of illocutionary acts and the functions of illocutionary acts used in the *Tu Ngawu* ceremony. The study in this analysis used qualitative method. This study used Searle's theory and Leech's theory to analyze the types and functions of illocutionary acts. The data was in the form of utterances. In this study, the data was taken from utterances containing illocutionary acts when the spokespersons of each party spoke to each other and interview recordings. The results of this study show that there are 30 illocutionary acts used in the *Tu Ngawu* ceremony which consist of several types, namely assertive, directive, commissive, expressive and declarative types. The most types of illocution found are assertive type with 12 data, directive 10 data, expressive 5 data commissive 1 data and declarative type is not found in this study. There are three functions found by researchers, namely competitive function, convivial function and collaborative function.
