

## ABSTRAK

**Bunganaen, Anjelina Penaten. 2026. Tindakan Ilokusi yang ditemukan dalam Serial *From* musim I. Skripsi. Program Study Sastra Inggris. Fakultas Hukum dan Sosial Humaniora. Universitas Flores. Pembimbing I: Dr. Drs Rambut Kanisius, M. Hum. Pembimbing II: Maksimilianus Doi, S.S., M.Pd.**

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Penelitian ini berfokus pada analisis tipe dan fungsi tindak tutur Ilokusi yang ditemukan dalam dialog serial televisi *From* musim I berdasarkan teori tindak tutur Searle (1969) dan Searle (1979) dengan judul “Tindakan Ilokusi yang ditemukan dalam Serial ‘*From*’ Musim I”. Penelitian ini menggunakan metode deskriptif kualitatif. Data penelitian ini berupa dialog yang diambil dari 10 episode serial *From* musim 1. Penulis menggunakan teknik purposive sampling untuk mengambil 15 data sebagai sampel representatif untuk dianalisis secara mendalam. Data-data tersebut dianalisis dengan cara mengklasifikasikan tindak tutur ilokusi ke dalam lima kategori ilokusi yaitu asertif, direktif, ekspresif, komisif, dan deklaratif, juga mengidentifikasi fungsi komunikatifnya dalam konteks dialog.

Hasil penelitian menunjukkan 13 tindak tutur asertif, 11 tindak tutur direktif, 5 tindak tutur ekspresif, 1 tindak tutur komisif, dan 1 tindak tutur deklaratif. Hasil penelitian mengindikasikan bahwa tindak tutur asertif dan direktif merupakan jenis tindak tutur yang paling dominan, yang mencerminkan penggunaan bahasa oleh para tokoh untuk menyampaikan informasi, memberikan perintah dan mengajukan permintaan dalam situasi yang penuh ketegangan dalam serial tersebut. Penelitian ini diharapkan dapat memberikan kontribusi bagi kajian pragmatik, khususnya dalam analisis tindak tutur pada media audiovisual.

## ABSTRACT

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This study focused on analyzing the types and functions of illocutionary act found in the dialogue of television series 'From' season I based on the speech act theory of Searle (1969) and Searle (1979) with the title *Illocutionary Act Found in Series From Season 1*. This study employed a qualitative descriptive method. The data consisted of dialogues taken from 10 episodes of 'From' season 1, collected through the transcription of series. This study purposive sampling has applied to select 15 dialogue data as representative samples for in depth analysis. The data were analyzed by classifying speech acts into five illocutionary act such as assertive, directives, expressive, commissive and declarative speech acts and also identifying communicative functions of speech acts in context.

The result reveal that the speech acts identified included 11 directives speech act, 13 assertives speech act, 5 expressive speech act, 1 commissive speech act and 1 declaratives speech act. The result of the study indicated the assertives and directives speech act are the most dominant, reflected how the characters uses of language to convey information, give commands, and make requests in tense situations in the series. This study expected to contribute to pragmatic studies, particularly in the analysis of speech act in audiovisual media.



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

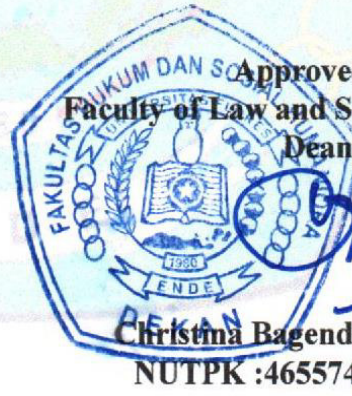
