
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ABSTRAK

Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk menentukan tipe dari ungkapan tabu dalam bahasa Lamaholot yang ditemukan dalam komunikasi sehari-hari masyarakat di desa Riangkoli berdasarkan theory yang di ajukan oleh Allan dan Burrige (2006), yaitu: Jargon, Slang, Swearing, dan Insult. Penelitian ini menggunakan metode deskriptif kualitatif. Data dalam penelitian ini menggunakan metode wawancara dan studi dokumentasi.

Hasil penelitian ini menunjukkan bahwa diantara empat tipe tabu yang diajukan oleh Allan dan Burrige (2006), terdapat 3 tipe tabu yang ditemukan dalam bahasa lamoholot di yang digunakan oleh masyarakat di desa Riangkoli, kabupaten Flores Timur dalam komunikasi sehari-hari yaitu, *slang*, *swearing* dan *insult*.

ABSTRACT

This study aimed at finding the types of taboo expressions in the Lamaholot language found in the daily conversation of people in Riangkoli village based on the theory proposed by Allan and Burrige (2006), namely: Jargon, Slang, Swearing, and Insult. This study used a qualitative descriptive method. The data in this study used interviews and documentation study method.

The results of this study indicate that among the four types of taboos proposed by Allan and Burrige (2006), there are 3 types of taboo found in Lamoholot language used by people in Riangkoli village, Flores Timur Regency in daily conversation, namely, slang, swearing and insults. .

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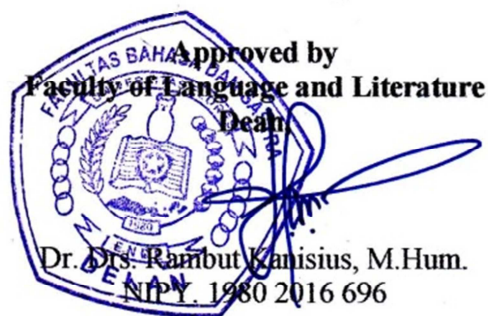
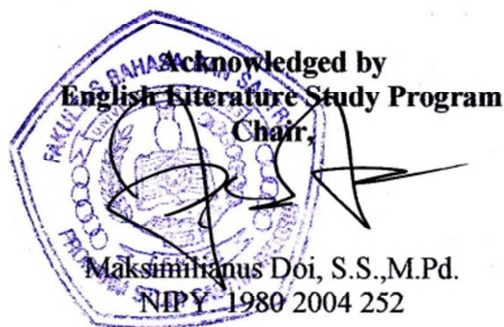
